GFA Scholarship Program Expands and Offers New Flexibility

Eligibility criteria and application deadlines for high school students graduating in 2025 who intend to continue their education at an accredited 2-year or 4-year school.

Goodenow Family Association Scholarship Honor Roll: Levels of giving are:

- Founding \$100/year
- Heritage \$250/year
- Legacy \$500/year (3 donations have already been received at the Legacy level)

Goodenow Family Association Scholarship Fund Campaign

- The changes adopted at the 2024 GFA Reunion risk depleting the GFA's savings.
 - o Increasing the scholarship amount for students attending a 2-year school (from \$750 per year to \$1,000 per year; maximum per student would be \$2,000 and maximum for 2 students supported simultaneously would be \$3,000)
 - Extending grant eligibility for students at 4-year schools from 2 years to 4 years (\$1,500 per year for 4 years; maximum per student could reach \$6,000 and maximum for 4 students supported simultaneously would equal \$15,000)
- An appeal will be made to members to shore up the reserves for Scholarships by making contributions (not tax-deductible).
- Levels of giving and recognition are: Founding \$100/year; Heritage \$250/year; Legacy \$500/year.

Charles Lyman Goodnow, 1827-1890

This family member was a descendant of the Immigrant Capt. Edmund, through both his father and mother. Born in Sudbury, he spent his working years in Boston in the produce business, and returned to Sudbury to farm with his son, Charles Frederick Goodnow.

The 2024 GFA Reunion (cont'd)

Insights from Russ and Carolyn Goodenough: Russ is the author of <u>Westward Wagons: An American Family</u> <u>Journey</u>, which traces the Goodenow ancestors from England to Massachusetts to the mid-west, and culminating in his great-grandfather and his family's arrival by wagon train in California. He shared some of his observations on genealogy research.

Garry Goodenough's Book Project: Garry is Canadian and plans to produce an anthology that brings together the family's history from many sources. He outlined the various areas he will focus on, and also shared his knowledge of

how his ancestors migrated from Vermont to New York state, to Iowa, to Minnesota, and ultimately homesteaded in Saskatchewan, Canada.
